




Fig.1: Map showing Bidadi Industrial Area Phase II.

The installation of the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) shall be got certified by an independent expert and a report in this regard should be submitted to the SEIAA before the project is commissioned for operation. The industries are also advised to adapt Zero Liquid discharge technology wherever possible/ applicable efficient for treatment wastewater, so that the treated water conform to the norms and standards prescribed by KSPCB/CPCB and also so that there is zero discharge of effluent from the industry & 100% reuse/recycle of the treated water.

4.0. Environmental Monitoring Details:

The MoEF&CC/ SEIAA has made mandatory to submit Six- monthly Compliance reports for everyone who has obtained Environmental Clearance. For this purpose of preparing Compliance report and Environmental Monitoring, the KIADB has provided the work to M/s. Robust Materials Technology Pvt. Ltd. to carry out Environmental Monitoring for Industrial Areas.

4.1. Ambient Air Quality Monitoring:

The Ambient Air Quality Monitoring is carried out for parameters such as Respirable Particular Matter (PM 10), Fine Particulate Matter (PM 2.5), Sulphur Dioxide (SO2) and Nitrogen Dioxide (NO2) at 8 Locations and the detailed reports are attached as **Annexure-4.**

The monitoring results reveal the following pollutant concentration with respect to PM, SOx and NOX:

This has reference to your applications No. KIADB/Do & EE-1/619/2012-13 dated: 27.09.2013 addressed to SEIAA, Karnataka and subsequent letters addressed to SEIAA/SEAC, Karnataka seeking prior environmental clearance for the above project under the EIA Notification, 2006. The proposal has been appraised as per prescribed procedure in the light of the provisions under the EIA Notification, 2006 on the basis of the mandatory documents enclosed with the application viz., the Application in Form 1, prefeasibility report and the additional clarifications furnished in response to the observations of the State Expert Appraisal Committee (SEAC), Karnataka.

It is, inter-alia, noted that M/s. Karnataka Industrial Area Development Board (KIADB), have proposed for development of industrial area in 2 sectors on a plot area of 636.44 Acres (Sector 1: 183.13 Acres & Sector 2: 453.31 Acres) (Details of the land as in Annexure). Out of 183.13 acres of sector 1, 149.34 acres area is for production blocks of industrial, 3.53 acres area is for civic amenities, 2.00 acres area is for utility, 15.52 acres area is for park & buffer and 12.74 acres area is for roads. Out of 453.31 acres of sector 2, 288.75 acres area is for production blocks of industrial, 48.90 acres area is for KSHDC, 15.40 acres area is for civic amenities & parking, 52.46 acres is for park & buffer, 3.00 acres area

is for utility, 10.80 acres area is for ashraya colony and 34 acres area is for roads. Total water requirement for the industrial area is 3620 KLD (Domestic: 285 KLD + Industrial: 1265 KLD+ Gardening: 2100 KLD) will be met from BWS&SB/tertiary treated water. Total waste water generated is 1150 KLD (Domestic effluent: 260 KLD + Industrial effluent: 890 KLD). Domestic waste water will be treated in CSTP and industrial effluent will be treated in CETP. Total power requirement is 2700 KW will be sourced from KPTCL. Alternative power requirement is 1500 KW DG set. The total project cost is Rs. 448 Crores.

The State Level Expert Appraisal Committee (SEAC) examined the proposal in the meeting held on 23rd & 24th November 2012, 14th & 15th February 2013 & 5th April 2013 and has recommended for issue of Environmental Clearance.

The State Environmental Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) Karnataka has considered the project in its meeting held on 17th May 2013 and after due consideration of the relevant documents submitted by the project proponent and additional clarifications furnished in response to its observations and the appraisal and recommendation of the SEAC, have accorded environmental clearance as per the provisions of Environmental Impact Assessment Notification-2006 and its subsequent amendments, subject to strict compliance of the terms and conditions as follows:

A-SPECIFIC CONDITIONS

I. Construction Phase:

- "Consent for Establishment" shall be obtained front "Karnataka State Pollution Control Board under Air and Water Act and a copy shall be submitted to the SEIAA, Karnataka before start of any construction work at the site.
- 2. Set up an environment management cell with appropriate lab facility shall be created as the project starts. It shall monitor all necessary parameters and activities during construction and operational phases from day one. The cell also ensures that the cell manages / maintains all the environmental aspects such as sewage treatment, solid waste disposal, maintenance of green belt areas, etc.
- All required sanitary and hygienic measures should be in place before starting construction activities and to be maintained throughout the construction phase. Sufficient number of toilets/bathrooms shall be provided with required mobile toilets, mobile STP for construction work force.
- 4. A First Aid Room should be provided in the Project both during construction and operation of the project.
- Adequate drinking water and sanitary facilities should be provided for construction workers at the site. The safe disposal of wastewater and solid wastes generated during the construction phase should be ensured.
- 6. Provision shall be made for the housing of construction labourers within the site with all necessary infrastructures. The housing may be in the

- form of temporary structures to be removed after the completion of the project. The facilities shall include the creche.
- 7. Provision should be made for the supply of fuel (kerosene or cooking gas); utensils such as pressure cookers etc. to the labourers during construction phase.
- 8. All the labourers to be engaged for construction should be screened for health and adequately treated before engaging them to work at the site and detailed report submitted to SEIAA. Safety standards as per National Building Code (NBC) should be ensured.
- For dis-infection of wastewater which is not meant for recycling for toilet flushing, use ultra violet radiation and not chlorination. For treated wastewater meant for reuse for toilet flushing, disinfect by using chlorination.
- 10. All the topsoil excavated during construction activities should be stored for use in horticulture / landscape development within the project site.
 - 11. Disposal of muck, construction debris during construction phase should not create any adverse effect on the neighbouring communities and be disposed taking the necessary precautions for general safety and health aspects of people, only in approved sites with the approval of competent authority.
 - 12. Soil and ground water samples should be tested at the project site during the construction phase to ascertain that there is no threat to ground water quality by leaching of heavy metals and or other toxic contaminants and report submitted to SEIAA.
 - 13. Construction spoils, including bituminous material and other hazardous materials, must not be allowed to contaminate watercourses and the dumpsites for such material must be secured so that they should not leach into the ground water.
 - 14. The diesel generator sets to be used during construction phase should be of low sulphur diesel type and should conform to E (P) Rules prescribed for air and noise emission standards.
 - 15. The diesel required for operating DG sets shall be stored in underground tanks and if required, clearance from Chief Controller of Explosives shall be taken.
 - 16. Vehicles hired for bringing construction material to the site should be in good condition and should conform to the applicable air and noise emission standards and should be operated only during non-peak hours.
 - 17. Ambient noise levels should conform to the residential standards both during day and night. Incremental pollution loads on the ambient air and noise quality should be closely monitored during construction phase. Adequate measures to reduce air and noise pollution during construction keeping in mind CPCB norms on noise limits.
 - Fly ash should be used as building material in the construction as per the provisions of Fly Ash Notification of September 1999 and amended as on August 2003.
 - 19. Ready mixed concrete must be used in building construction.
 - 20. Storm water control and its re-use as per CGWB and BIS standards for various applications.

- 21. Water demand during construction should be reduced by use of premixed concrete, curing agents and other best practices and only tertiary treated water shall be used for construction as per G.O. No. FEE 188 ENV 2003 dated 14.08.2003.
- 22. No ground water is to be drawn without permission from the Central/State Ground Water Authority.
- 23. Separation of grey and black water should be done by the use of dual plumbing line for separation of grey and black water.
- 24. Treatment of 100% grey water by decentralized treatment should be
- 25. The provision of Energy Conservation Building code, 2006 shall be fully complied with.
- 26. Roof should meet prescriptive requirement as per Energy Conservation Building Code, 2007 by using appropriate thermal insulation material.
- 27. Opaque wall should meet prescriptive requirement as per Energy Conservation Building Code, 2007 which is proposed to be mandatory for all air conditioned spaces while it is optional for non-air conditioned spaces by use of appropriate thermal insulation material to fulfil requirement.
- 28. The Proponent shall obtain the construction material such as stones and jelly etc. only from the approved quarries and other construction material shall also be procured from the authorized agencies/traders.
- 29. The proponent shall obtain approval from the competent authorities for structural safety of the building due to earthquake, adequacy of fire fighting equipment etc. as per the National Building Code (NBC) including protection measures for lightening etc.
- 30. The project authority shall ensure that no water bodies are polluted due to project activities and nala/water bodies within the project areas are well protected with sufficient buffer.
- 31. Safety standards as per National Building Code (NBC), 2005 should be followed and ensured.
- 32. The project Authorities shall ensure that the National Building Code, 2005 is complied with and adhered to.
- 33. The project authorities shall not use Kharab land if any, for any purpose and keep available to the general public duly displaying a board as public property. No structure of any kind be put up in the Kharab land and shall be afforested and maintained as green belt only.
- 34. The authorities should include the condition while issuing plots to the prospective individual industries that they should develop greenbelt of 33 % of the plot area allotted for them.
- 35. The industrial units in the industrial area and the associated facilities shall be strictly in accordance with the norms laid down by the Karnataka State Government and KSPCB/CPCB.
- 36. The project authorities shall strictly adhere to the commitments made in the letter No. IADB/JDTP/EC /90/3479/2013-14 dated 04.06.2013 with regard to establishment of STP/CETP, buffer zone, green belt, conditions to be incorporated in the lease document while allotting plots to individual industries, environment safety aspects etc.

37. The project authorities shall undertake the activities towards the corporate social commitment plan made vide letter dated 11.03.2013 with a total budget not less than Rs. 13 Lakhs and shall be executed within a period of 2013-2017 as committed and report be submitted to the Authority.

II. Operation Phase.

- The Company shall implement all the recommendations made in the Environmental Impact Assessment / EMP report and risk assessment report.
- 2. The installation of the Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) shall be got certified by an independent expert and a report in this regard should be submitted to the SEIAA before the project is commissioned for operation. Treated effluent emanating from STP shall be recycled/reused to the maximum extent possible. Treatment of 100% grey water by decentralized treatment should be done. Discharge of treated sewage shall conform to the norms & standards of the Karnataka State Pollution Control Board. Treated sewage should be used for flushing, gardening, etc. as proposed. Necessary measures should be made to mitigate the odour problem from STP.
- The solid waste generated should be properly collected and segregated.
 Wet garbage should be composted and dry / inert solid waste should be
 disposed off to the approved sites for land filling after recovering
 recyclable material.
- 4. Diesel power generating sets proposed as source of backup power for elevators and common area illumination during operation phase should be of enclosed type and conform to rules made under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986. The height of stack of DG sets should be equal to the height needed for the combined capacity of all proposed DG sets. Use low sulphur diesel. The location of the DG sets may be decided with in consultation with Andhra Pradesh Pollution Control Board.

- 12. Energy conservation measures like installation of CFLs/TFLs for the lighting the areas outside the building should be integral part of the project design and should be in place before project commissioning. The project authorities shall strictly comply with the rules and regulations under Manufacture, Storage and Import of Hazardous Chemicals Rules, 1989 as amended in October 1994 and January 2000. all transportation of Hazardous Chemicals shall be as per the MVA, 1989. Authorization from the KSPCB shall be obtained for collection, treatment, storage, and disposal of hazardous wastes.
- 16. The project authorities must strictly comply with the rules and regulations with regard to handling and disposal of hazardous wastes in accordance with the Hazardous Wastes (Management and Handling) Rules, 2003. Authorization from the KSPCB must be obtained for collection/treatment/storage/disposal of hazardous wastes.
- 17. Application of solar energy should be incorporated for illumination of common areas, lighting for gardens and street lighting in addition to provision for solar water heating. A hybrid system or fully solar system for lighting and heating should be provided. Details in this regard should be submitted to the SEIAA.
- 18. The individual industries & residential developments shall take all necessary clearances including Environment clearance in accordance with the law. The project Authority shall incorporate such condition in the lease/ sale deed/ Agreement.
- 19. The project authorities shall bifurcate the industrial plots and residential plots with a thick and tall vegetative barrier green belt.
- 20. The project Authority shall incorporate a condition in the prospective lease/sale deed/Agreement with individual industries that they also shall abide by the conditions of this environmental clearance.

- 11. Concealing factual data or submission of false/fabricated data and failure to comply with any of the conditions mentioned above may result in withdrawal of this clearance and attract action under the provisions of Environmental (Protection) Act, 1986.
- 12. Any appeal against this environmental clearance shall lie with the National Green Tribunal, if preferred, within a period of 30 days as prescribed under Section 16 of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010.
- 13. Officials from the Department of Environment and Ecology, Bangalore/ Regional Office of MoEF, Bangalore who would be monitoring the implementation of Environmental sateguards should be given full.

All other statutory clearances such as the approvals for storage of diesel from Chief Controller of Explosives, Fire Department, Civil Aviation Department, Forest Conservation Act, 1980 and Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 etc. shall be obtained, as applicable by project proponents from the competent authorities.
- 17. These stipulations would be enforced among others under the provisions of water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act, 1974, the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) act 1981, the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986, the Public Liability (Insurance) Act, 1991 and EIA Notification, 2006.



With reference to the above, it is to be informed that this Board hereby accords Consent for Establishment under the Water (Prevention & Control of Pollution) Act 1974 to development of Industrial Area with total area of 636.44 Acres (Sector I - 183.13 Acres & Sector II - 453.31 Acres) located at Bidadi Industrial Area, Phase - II, Sector I & II, Bidadi Ramanagar Taluk and District, subject to the following conditions.

I. Environmental Aspects and Management during the course of construction:

a) The applicant should cover the project site from all sides by raising sufficiently tall barricades with sheets to ensure that pollutarits should not spill to the surroundings.

- b) The applicant shall arrange services like housing facility, water supply, sewage facilities on a temporary basis at construction site and same shall be maintained without any adverse impact on the environment.
- c) The applicant shall control the movement of vehicles carrying construction materials in order to avoid noise pollution in the surrounding.
- d) The project proponent shall strictly adhere to the conditions stipulated in the Environmental clearance issued from the MoEF & CC, Government of India, vide No. F.No. 21-67/2012-IA.III dated 21.07.2015.
- e) The applicant shall strictly adhere to the zoning Regulation with respect to buffer zone towards any Lake, Nala, drain or any other water bodies as per the local planning authority guidelines or as per any plan sanctioning authority.
- f) The applicant shall submit final approved plan from competent authority to the Board before taking up any construction activities.
- g) The applicant shall seek extension through a letter 45 days in advance of the expiry of validity period of CFE/CFExpn order with proper reasons for seeking such extension if required.
- h) The applicant to maintain 5 rows of plantation along the boundaries of the industrial area and to see that only green category industries are allotted towards the adjoining village limits.
- i) The applicant shall not discharge any kind of effluent into the tanks or to any water bodies.
- 1. This consent for establishment shall be <u>valid for a period of Five years</u> from the date of issue of this Order.
- 2. The applicant shall maintain natural nallah and other such feature as in the Revenue Survey map.
- 3. The applicant shall not take expansion/diversification without the prior consent of the Board.
- **4.** The applicant shall obtain necessary licence/clearance from their relevant agencies before taking up construction.
- 5. KIADB authorities shall earmark a dedicated area for common facilities like CETP and CSTP, common solid waste treatment and Hazardous waste management.
- 6. The applicant shall maintain utilities including STP for a minimum period of five years.
- 7. The applicant shall use treated sewage for secondary purposes including construction.
- 8. This CFE is issued only from the point of water pollution control only and does not have any relevance over land dispute, any pending cases with any Departments/Hon'ble Courts.

 Common Sewage Treatment Plant (CSTP) and Solid waste processing facility (for organic) shall be provided and operated satisfactorily by the project proponent himself before it is handed over to Association/Company.

II. WATER CONSUMPTION:

- 1. The water consumption shall not exceed 1265 KLD for Industrial purpose & shall not exceed 225 KLD for domestic purpose.
- 2. No ground water is to be drawn without permission from the Central/State Ground Water Authority.

III. WATER POLLUTION CONTROL:

- 1. The quantity of waste water generation shall not exceed 890 KLD for industrial use & shall not exceed 180 KLD from domestic use.
- The applicant shall install common sewage treatment (CSTP) of capacity 180 KLD and Common Effluent treatment plant (CETP) of capacity 1 MLD for treatment of waste water generation from the proposed industrial layout.
- 3. The applicant shall submit the complete design details of the CETP along with treatment schemes and obtain prior approval from the Board before installation of the same to meet the standards stipulated by the Board regarding process effluents before utilizing for urban reuse viz. landscape irrigation, vehicle washing, toilet flushing, use in fire protection and commercial air conditioners.
- **4.** The applicant shall treat the sewage to meet the following standards stipulated below before utilization for secondary purposes.

- **5.** Applicant shall add appropriate disinfectant to the treated sewage to residual chlorine preferably in the range of 1 mg/l. to 3 mg/l.
- 6. The applicant shall treat pretreated waste water from individual units in their 2.0 MLD CETP.
- 7. The secondary and tertiary treated waste water will be supplied to industries for cooling, flushing & gardening.
- 8. If the treatment plant do not achieve the effluent standards stipulated above or if it is found to be inadequate, then the applicant shall have to modify the units so as to meet the standards with prior consent of the Board.

- 9. All the treatment units shall be made impervious and there shall not be any discharge of sewage outside the premises.
- 10. The applicant shall provide separate energy meter to liquid waste treatment plant and STP and also shall provide flow meters. A log book of readings shall be maintained.
- 11. The applicant should make provisions for dual piping system to use the treated sewage water for toilet flushing, gardening and other purposes.
- 12. The applicant shall dispose excess treated sewage i.e. left after using for secondary purposes. The applicant shall maintain log book and vehicle details in this regard.

IV. AIR POLLUTION CONTROL:

- 1. The applicant during construction shall ensure that the Ambient Air Quality in its premises shall conform to the National Ambient Air Quality Standards specified in Environment (Protection) Rules.
- 2. The applicant shall provide acoustic measures to the DG Sets as per Sl. No. 94 in Schedule-I of Environment (Protection) Rules.
- 3. The applicant shall provide dust suppression systems with water sprinkling system during construction period.

V. NOISE POLLUTION CONTROL:

The applicant shall ensure that the ambient noise levels and ambient air quality within
its premises during construction and after construction shall not exceed the limits
specified in the Environment (Protection) Rules, i.e. 75 dB(A) Leq during day time and
70 dB(A) Leq during night time during and after construction.

VI. SOLID WASTE & HAZARDOUS WASTE DISPOSAL:

- The applicant shall collect, treat and dispose off all solid waste generated during construction i.e. Muck, and Garbage after construction if any in such manner so as not to cause environmental pollution.
- The applicant shall apply and obtain authorization for management & handling of waste oil under Hazardous & other Waste (Management & Transboundary Movement) Rules, 2016.
- 3. The applicant shall earmark sufficient place for segregation and processing and convert the bio-degradable solid waste generated from unit into compost within their premises with scientific method.
- The applicant shall strictly follow the Government Notification No. FEE 17 EPC 2012 Bangalore dated 11.03.2016 with regard to plastics ban.

5. The applicant shall strictly follow Construction & Demolition Waste Management Rules, 2016.

6. The applicant shall earmark minimum of 5 acres and maximum of 25 acres of land for the purpose of establishing CETP, Hazardous Waste and Municipal Solid waste collection centers in the industrial area.

VII. HEALTH & SAFETY:

- The applicant shall provide all necessary healthcare facilities to workers and shall carry out routine health survey among workers.
- 2. The applicant shall provide all safety measures including personal protective equipments to workers during construction.

VIII. GENERAL:

- 1. The applicant shall adhere to the Zonal Regulations norms of competent authority.
- 2. The industrial units in the industrial area and the associated facilities shall be strictly in accordance with the norms laid down by the Karnataka State Government and Board.
- 3. The existing water body, canals and rajakaluve and other drainage and water bound structures if any shall be retained unaltered with due buffer zone as applicable and maintained under tree cover.
- 4. The natural sloping pattern of the project site other than the area excavated for the purpose of construction of proposed building shall remain unaltered and the natural hydrology of he area be maintained as it is to ensure natural flow of storm water.
- 5. Lakes and other water bodies within and/or at the vicinity of the project area shall be protected and conserved.
- **6.** The project Authority shall allow only the Orange and Green category industries and strictly as proposed in the layout plan.
- 7. The solid waste generated should be properly collected and segregated Wet garbage should be composted and dry/inert solid waste should be disposed off to the approved sites for land filling, after recovering recyclable material.
- 8. The project proponent shall ensure development of a minimum of 33% of the project area which shall include the butter zone and green belt developed by individual industries. The project authority may undertake compensatory green belt development through avenue plantation in the adjoin roads and in the civic amenity area if there is any shortfall within the project site in the unavoidable circumstances.
- 9. The provision of Energy Conservation Building code, 2006 shall be fully complied with.

10. The project authority shall ensure that no water bodies are polluted activities and the nala/water bodies if any within the project areas are well protected with sufficient buffer.

SENIOR ENVIRONMENTAL OFFICER

- 11. The project authorities shall not use Kharab land if any for any purpose and keep available to the general public duly displaying a board as public property. No structure of any kind be put up in the Kharab land and shall be afforested and maintained as green belt only.
- 12. The authorities should include the condition while issuing plots to the prospective individual industries that they should develop greenbelt of 33% of the plot area allotted for them.
- 13. The project proponent shall ensure that the greenery of the area is maintained. Further 33% of the project area shall be dedicated for green belt development. The local Forest Department shall be associated for this purpose and requisite budget earmarked.
- **14.** Adequate measures should be taken to prevent odour problem from solid waste processing plant and STP.
- **15.** The project authorities shall bifurcate the industrial plots and residential plots with a thick and tall vegetative barrier green belt.
- **16.** The project authority shall incorporate a condition in the prospective lease/sale deed/Agreement with individual industries that they also shall abide by the conditions of this E.C.
- 17. The applicant must create structure/storage facility for rain water harvesting and ground water recharge.
- **18.** The applicant should make provisions for dual piping system to use the treated sewage water for toilet flushing, gardening and other purposes.
- **19.** The applicant shall arrange for alternate power supply in the form of D.G.Set to run and operate the essential units of sewage treatment plant, in event of brake down of regular supply from Electricity Board.
- 20. The applicant shall implement the Environmental Management Plan during construction and after construction as given under EMP report.
- 21. The applicant shall not change or alter (a) building plan (b) the quality, quantity or rate of discharge/ emissions and (c) install/replace/alter the water or air pollution control measures without the prior approval of the Board.
- 22. The applicant shall immediately report to the Board of any accident or unforeseen act or event resulting in release of discharge of effluents or emissions or solid wastes etc., in excess of the standards stipulated, and the applicant shall immediately take appropriate corrective and preventive actions under intimation.
- 23. Exact date of commissioning of the sewage treatment plant shall be informed to this Board 45 days in advance so as to make necessary inspection of the plant and the pollution control measures provided by the applicant.

- 24. The applicant shall appoint a qualified Environmental Engineer/ Scientist for the Management of Environmental aspects and also establish Environmental Cell to oversee the operation of STP.
- **25.** The Board reserves the right to review, impose additional condition or conditions, revoke, change or alter the terms and conditions.
- 26. This CFE does not give any right to the Party/Project Authority to forego any legal requirement, which is necessary for setting/operation of the project.
- 27. The application shall adopt Eco-sanitation system in the project.
- 28. The applicant is liable to reinstate or restore, damaged or destroyed elements of environment at his cost, failing which, the applicant/occupier as the case may be shall be liable to pay the entire cost of remediation or restoration and pay in advance an amount equal to the cost estimated by Competent Agency or Committee.
- 29. The project authorities shall dispose scientifically Bio-Medical waste and electronic waste to authorized common disposal facility and authorized recyclers respectively by entering into agreement as per new Bio Medical Waste Management Rules, 2016 and E- Waste (Management) Rules, 2016.
- 30. The project authorities shall adopt green building concept.
- **31.** The project authorities shall establish Environmental Cell during operation phase to comprehensively manage environment related issues.
- **32.** Suitable local tree species shall be selected for greenery and minimum three rows of plant saplings shall be planted all-along the periphery of the site.
- 33. The CFE is issued without prejudice to the Court case pending in any Hon'ble Court.

Please note that separate consents of the Board for discharge of liquid effluent and the emissions to the air shall have to be obtained by remitting prescribed consent fee. The application for consent has to be made 45 days in advance to the completion of construction work of project. Issue of consent will be considered only after completion of Water pollution control measures, solid waste management facilities and installing air pollution control measures.
